Day 1

Arrival in Milan

Transfer from airport to the hotel. Milan is the economic centre of Italy and also the global point of reference for luxury and fashion. Time to relax before dinner. Overnight at the hotel.

Day 2

Milan – Bergamo - Bologna km 126

Private transfer by minibus/car to the rental company to collect the bikes.

Departure to Bologna for a visit to the city and a short walk between the churches and monuments.

Dinner and overnight stay in the historic centre.

Day 3

Bologna – Montegridolfo km 152

Departure from Bologna and stop at San Leo (RN).

Short visit to Rocca San Leo before continuing. After the visit to the small town, and a quick lunch in the heart of San Leo, based on cheeses and salami typical of Romagna, we will continue on to the small hamlet of Montegridolfo.

Situated in the hills of the Romagnan hinterlands, Montegridolfo is enclosed within its original medieval walls.

Overnight stay in and dinner in a typical Italian restaurant.





Day 4

Montegridolfo – Lago Trasimeno 216km

Departure at 8.00am.

After a few kilometres, we will stop for a visit to the spectacular Furlo Gorge. An authentic paradise, crossed by the Candigliano River between the imposing rocky walls. After the visit, we will continue to Lake Trasimeno with a short stop at Gubbio in the province of Perugia and Assisi, known to be the city where St. Francis, patron of Italy, and Saint Chiara were born, lived and died.

Short trip to Perugia and the destination, Lake Trasimeno.

Overnight stay and dinner.

Day 5

Lago Trasimeno – Siena - San Gimignano - Pisa - Lucca 220km

Departure in the morning to Siena, a famous city with its historical, artistic heritage and its medieval historic centre, as well as the famous Palio.

In 1995, its historic centre became a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Quick lunch.

Departure for Lucca passing through San Gimignano, which was also made a UNESCO World Heritage Site for the characteristic medieval architecture of its historic centre.

Brief view of Lucca, a remarkable city of Italian art, and famous for its historical monuments and the intact sixteenth century wall, officially of Roman origins.

Dinner and overnight stay.

Day 6

Lucca – Viareggio - Forte dei marmi - Portofino 161km

Wake up in the morning and head towards the coasts of the Ligurian Sea.

Short stop in the small town of Mare di Viareggio, known as a seaside resort, and then the fort of Marmi, also known as a holiday resort location.

Fish lunch on the seafront in a wonderful restaurant, and then we will continue on to Portofino. The most famous marina in the world rises in the midst of a natural promontory from the Bay of Portofino to its village square.

The Marina contains yachts and boats of all kinds and the town is resplendant in its elegance.

Dinner and overnight stay near the harbour.





Day 7

Portofino - Bergamo 302km


Breakfast at the hotel and then we will set off on our return to Bergamo. We will drop off the motorbikes in the afternoon and stay overnight at the hotel.
